Question 1

Noting that the Sustainability & Transformation Plan (STP) for south east London has now been published, what are the assumptions lying behind the financial projections and what are the engagement plans for the STP?

CCG Response

We will be undertaking on-going public engagement, not on the whole plan but parts of it, such as the plans for elective orthopaedic services. In time we may be required to undertake formal consultation on different services, depending on the extent of the change.

The main driver for change in the STP is community based care and that is where we will expect to see most local engagement.

We are happy to talk to any local groups about aspects of our plans, including details and assumptions that have been made.

Some local press reports about the STP have been incorrect, and we are happy to confirm that the Lewisham Hospital A&E is safe from the threat of closure.

Question 2

Notes of a previous CCG workshop refers to a diagram of how the STP mapped to Lewisham plans. Is that diagram available?

CCG Response

This has not yet been completed. It will cover CCG and integrated working plans for adults and for children and young people in the borough. There will be a lot of complex information that we will be trying to translate into a clear and understandable picture of all of our plans.

Question 3

What are the interdependencies between the STP and devolution?

CCG Response

The STP is underpinned by close working between councils, CCGs and providers, and also by the development of community based care. Devolution will make it easier to achieve our plans in the STP but one isn't reliant on the other.

The new devolution agreement will be signed by Lewisham's mayor. The previous agreement was an outline framework. London devolution can allow us to do more for Lewisham.

Our strategy for health and social care is part of the STP, while there is also a London-wide ambition. Devolution itself is about London taking control of things we could be doing, it provides flexibility to organise ourselves to do things differently, for instance around estates or workforce. The proposals also could help with ambitions for public health in Lewisham.

Question 4

Will it be possible to change the STP if a need to change arises through the development of local plans or devolution?

CCG Response

We expect the STP to be updated as required and further developed over time.

Question 5

Partnership between the statutory sector, including the NHS, and community sector will need to be part of the development of community based care. How is the CCG building that into the commissioning process?

CCG Response

We agree that the expertise of the voluntary and community groups can make an important contribution to ensure the success of our plans. Particularly through the council's Stronger Communities Partnership Board we are looking at ideas for

supporting and developing the voluntary and community sector, and for encouraging innovation.
